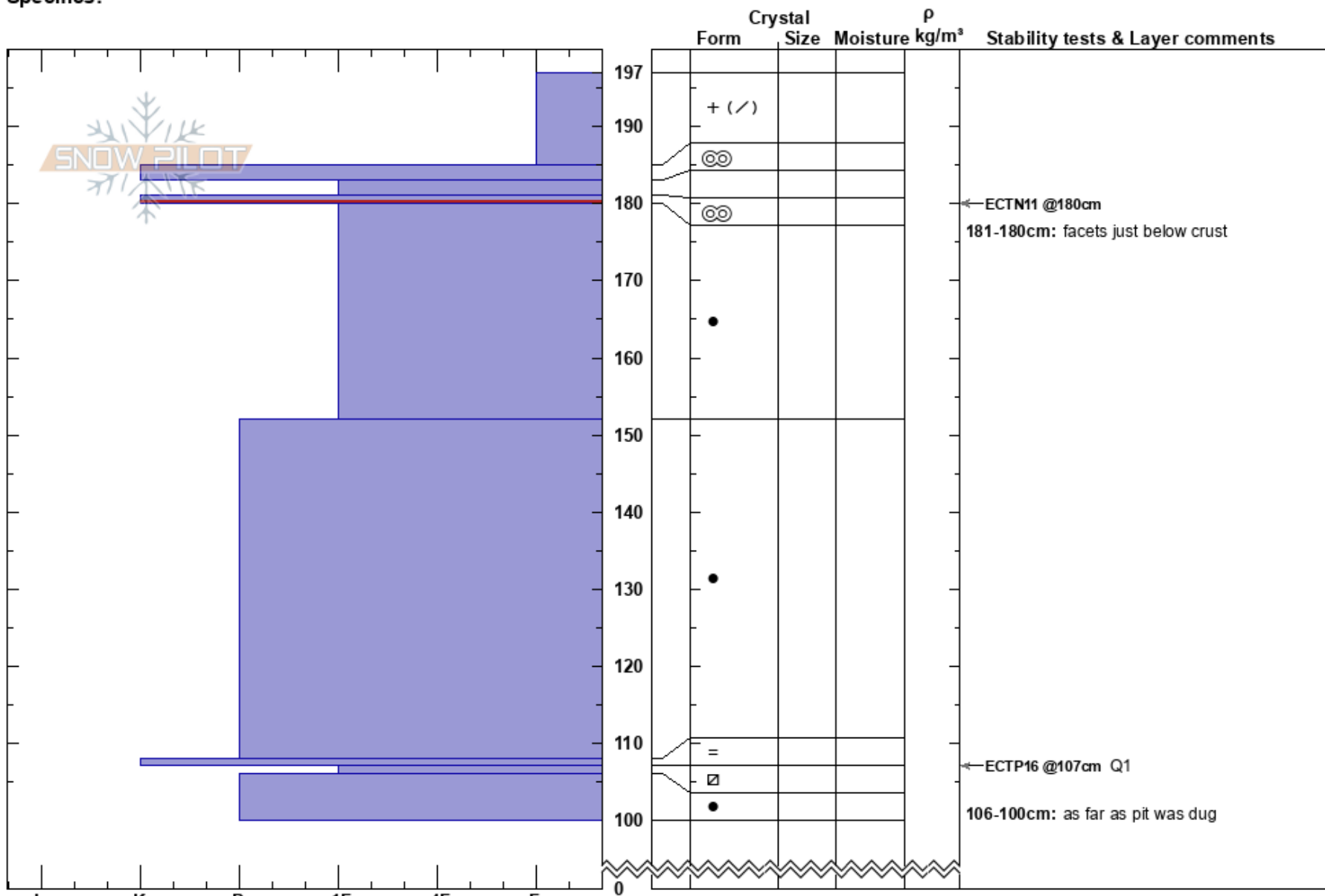

**Notes:** The buried rain crust below the storm snow of the last major cycle continues to show signs of collapsing and propagating. The greater concern going forward will be a lowest melt freeze crust form during the past week. It currently lacks enough snow on top of it, but shows signs of easily fracturing and propagating.
