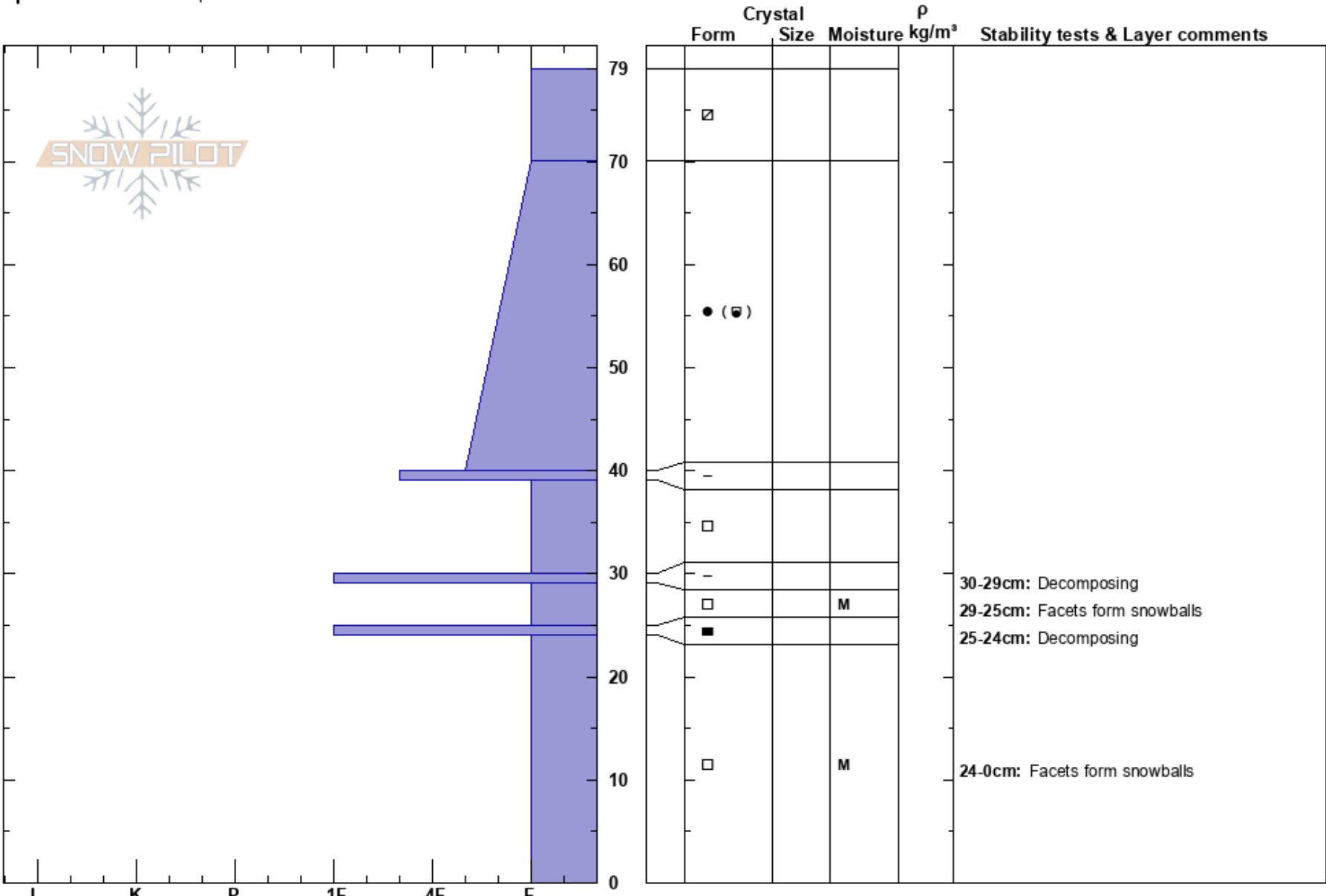

**Notes:** Widespread surface hoar and near-surface faceting, particularly on north aspects. Much of the top 10-20 cm of the snow is beginning to facet. The crust layers near the base were all decomposing. Basal facets becoming moist -- can form into snowballs.
